Introduction

The purpose of the meeting is essentially to scope those issues and actions which may be appropriately addressed by the Community Strategy. There is a need to get a draft strategy agreed by the Board on 3rd June for launch at the 24th June Forum Event. This is to be followed by an extensive period of public consultation during the summer and is also most certainly likely to be amended to reflect the local communities' aspirations and priorities.

The Board considers that it is not the intention of the Community Strategy to repeat existing organisations/partners plans, strategies or service plans. Rather to focus on those actions and issues where 'added value' can be given or new actions can be undertaken involving partnership working. The meeting is to explore this thematic with a view to identifying a vision and to focus on producing 2 or 3 areas of interest/action. - This thematic revolves around health issues, physical exercise, protection/prevention, etc. to improve and safeguard people's health and wellbeing

A suggested format for the meeting together with an 'aide memoire' to stimulate discussion and a compilation of the results of some local consultations were tabled by the District Council to help structure and inform stakeholders.

1. Scope

- Drugs, alcohol and substance misuse Issues also falls under "safer communities" but shouldn't be ruled out as they also have a major impact on health as well as under crime issues.
- Lack of treatment facilities for drug, alcohol and substance misusers.
- Lifestyle issues
 - physical activity.
 - alcohol.
 - Weight.
 - Preventative model required in preventing decline in health.
- Children's issues and inequalities (generally). Thrust of the Children's Bill is intervention
- Community support required/community development – links with "Opportunities for all".
- Older people – Best Value overview to look at issues.
- Bullying/domestic abuse/child abuse – *very important.*

- What can we do to add value by working with partners?

- High incidence of chronic heart disease more prevalent in men rather than in women in South Derbyshire, although South Derbyshire averages with nation-wide statistics with regard to coronary heart disease generally.

- Drugs mapping exercise including prevalence of usage to be completed in June.
- Lack of children's mental health services provision
- Breakdown of families - preventative services.
 - child protection.

- Domestic violence.
- Tackling determinants of health, e.g. housing.

2. Where are we now/some identified issues

- Development of crime/reduction groups.

 - prevent accidents *before* they happen. Usually something is done only after an accident.
- Lack of enforcement with regard to accidents, etc.
 - 'Low level' legislation (all partners).
- Views of hard to reach groups.
- Youth – lack of facilities.
 - need facilities to keep them occupied and out of trouble.
 - Diversionary tactics/things to do for young people.
 - Youth Needs survey done.
 - Youths not taken seriously.
- Lack of engagement business community.
- Identify commercial opportunities (e.g. cinema and other community facilities).

Chamber provided statistical information as well as the results of a survey.

- Only 5 large companies/employers.

- Very dependent on smaller business base to provide employment opportunities.
- Structure Plan job targets – unpredictable therefore allocates land.
- Increase in land take-up distorted by large developments (Bison) but a lot of local companies have expanded and moved to new premises.
- Lack of public transport access to major employment opportunities, e.g. Nottingham East Midlands Airport.(NEMA)
- Demand for low paid jobs by Nottingham East Midlands Airport may have a knock-on effect on other employers.
- Need people to live and work locally where possible for sustainability reasons.
- Create the building blocks that make sustainability achievable.
- Increase in tourism base - new facilities increasing demand.
 - small business development, growth in local businesses.
- Blockages to businesses developing, especially in the rural areas/generally.
 - small business IT skills
 - DRCC 'vital village' focus? – Provide a 'local' village business focus (e.g. Wirksworth broadband from which other initiatives developed).
 - 'Village Plans' – expand to include business focus identification of gaps in local service provision, e.g. home care, which might generate employment opportunities.
 - Business crime? – Links to "Safer Communities", to come on to Government Agenda – what police support.
- Lack of local Business Directory – "Source Derbyshire". Is this required ?

3. Views of Local People

- Lack of business views from BL/Chamber clients but these may not necessarily be representative of the area.
- Generic issues - business crime – lack of information.
 - excessive bureaucracy - health and safety/taxation
 - can enforcing agencies respond?
 - trading standards through libraries.
 - more user friendly one-stop shop.
- Cost of living and wage issues.
- Cost of housing for local people.
- Lack of pure 'incubator' facilities.
- What has happened regarding "creative workspace" development.

 - Quality of housing development and adaptability for disabled.
- Key opportunities
