# 1. Recommendations

1.1 That the first Quarter performance be noted.

### 2. Purpose of Report

- 2.1 To note and scrutinise the performance of Environmental Services as at first quarter.
- 2.2 To note the first formal reporting of performance for Disabled Facilities Grants, via the agreed Local Performance Indicators

#### 3. Executive Summary

- 3.1 100% of all Environmental Services BVPI's are on target.
- 3.2 59% of all Environmental Services indicators are within target and 78% are on target or within 5% of target.
- 3.3 The only Housing BVPI's relating to Environmental Services is BVPI 64 for which comparative data is not currently published. Current performance on this indicator suggests we are on target.
- 3.4 The LPI's for Disabled Adaptations show poor performance levels. The operational improvements to address these have already been put in place and are expected to begin to register in the statistics over the coming months.
