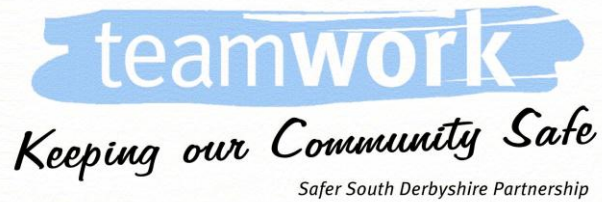

	Sheila Jackson welcomed everyone to the meeting and introductions were made from the panel.  Apologies were received from Linda Roberts (SDDC Housing)	
2	Minutes of last meeting (to be agreed) and update on actions	Action
	The minutes were agreed as a true record of the last meeting.	
3	Safer Neighbourhoods Sergeant's Overview / Priorities Update	Action
	<p>Sgt Thompson ran through crime statistics from 1<sup>st</sup> April 2013 to the end of January 2014 compared with the same period the year before.</p> <p>Violent crime has reduced; domestic dwelling burglaries have reduced; non-domestic burglaries have reduced; other thefts have reduced; shoplifting has increased by 3 offences; vehicle crime has reduced; damage/arson has increased by 5 offences, which were domestic with damage to vehicles and dwellings. Anti-social behaviour has reduced by 17%, which equates to 43 fewer calls to service.</p> <p>PCSO McMillan gave feedback to issues raised at the last meeting: -            Farmers were contacted about mud left on the roads.            Vehicles parked at Hillside – none were seen by Police.            Person with metal detector digging up ground at Overseal – issue now dealt with.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• During Halloween dedicated patrols took place and a total of 40 calls to service were received over the week.</li> <li>• Over Christmas and New Year, all pubs in the area were visited.</li> <li>• Cannabis charges were made concerning three males in Linton, one male in Overseal and one male arrested in Lullington.</li> <li>• Speeding into Netherseal – Police have been on-site and liaised with the Parish Council regarding the sharp corner entering the village from the Cricketts.</li> <li>• Speeding at Appleby Glade – 250 vehicles passed through in one hour from A444 towards Swadlincote. One motorbike was clocked travelling at 52 mph.</li> <li>• Two males are on bail following theft from a Walton farm and one for poaching pheasants.</li> <li>• Two males have been dealt with following the theft of a pallet truck.</li> <li>• A speed gun operation was carried out on Burton Road, Rosliston. Speeds averaged at 27 mph up to 33 mph.</li> <li>• Hillside speed checks were carried out with one vehicle clocked travelling at 35 mph, which was dealt with</li> <li>• A Section 59 Warning was issued between Coton and Walton.</li> <li>• Patrols outside schools – Linton Primary, two tickets issued.</li> </ul>	

	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Anti-social behaviour calls are low. One call received regarding youths gathering at the tunnel in Bridge Street. Residents stated that this is a problem area with gangs of youths gathering frequently. One resident felt intimidated by youths at the bridge.</li> <li>• Sgt Thompson discussed allocating Police resources and working alongside Trading Standards and the Council's Wardens, licensing checks, test purchasing and clamping down on underage drinking. Sgt Thompson urged residents to ring these incidents into the Police so that those committing crimes are dealt with through the proper systems and made to do restorative justice community work.</li> </ul> <p>Cllr Jones asked the Police to be aware of major excavations being carried out at the traveller's site on Park Road, Overseal. The road has frequently been left in a muddy, dangerous state.</p>	
<b>4</b>	<b>Partnership Update / Funding / New project ideas</b>	
	<p>Phil Marriott updated the group with Partnership news.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Prison, me no way project has been running in all senior schools. This shows the pupils an insight into prison life using a mock-up cell, roll play and real life stories from prisoners.</li> <li>• The Sports partnership has been involved with a cycle maintenance project with children at risk of anti-social behaviour, together with brighter bikes and bike-ability sessions.</li> <li>• The Shout-Out project works with those with disabilities and victims of hate crime.</li> <li>• Training has been carried out recently with Neighbourhood Watch Co-ordinators, which should roll-out across the County.</li> <li>• National Internet Safety Day will take place on 7<sup>th</sup> February.</li> <li>• Relationships week takes place between 10<sup>th</sup> and 14<sup>th</sup> February.</li> <li>• International Women's Day takes place on 7<sup>th</sup> March, with input from the Domestic Abuse Action Group at Sharpe's Pottery.</li> <li>• A business booster event will take place at Sharpe's Pottery in Swadlincote in conjunction with the Council's Economic Development team.</li> </ul> <p><b>Funding</b> – All underspend from other areas has now been pooled together. An application from the Village Games project for £10,000 across the whole of South Derbyshire. A request for £500 from Area 6 was granted. A total of £1,788 was spent last year including CCTV at Overseal Bowls Club and CCTV at Netherseal Village Hall</p>	
<b>5</b>	<b>Local Issues – open forum</b>	
	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Coton resident raised that extensive waterworks were being carried out in the village, which were taking a long time. Chapel Street has been closed and a diversion is in place. Speeding vehicles have been an issue and many works vehicles and machines are parked around the village. The work should be finished by the end of February. Police advised that they travel through regularly. Parish Council liaise frequently with the site management.</li> <li>• Parking issues were raised at the Post Office in Castle Gresley and at the Linton junction with Burton Road there is a car parked right on the junction, which makes it very difficult to see.</li> <li>• Resident praised Derbyshire Alert but they never seem to post resolutions.</li> <li>• Complaints were made about mud being left on the road at the St Modwens development at Castle Gresley. A clean-up vehicle goes out at night. Resident raised that it was a combination of the housing site and the local farm.</li> </ul>	<p>Police to patrol the village.</p> <p>Police to investigate.</p> <p>The Clerk of Works attended site. Some slight staining of the carriageway surface was noted but no problems were observed.</p>

LA/18 **APOLOGIES**

Apologies for absence from the Meeting were received from H Wheeler MP; Councillor Frost and S Jackson

LA/19 **DECLARATIONS OF INTEREST**

None.

LA/20 **CHAIRMAN'S ANNOUNCEMENTS**

Draft Local Plan comments have been collated and are currently being considered. Pre-submission Plan to be consulted on in March through into April. The pre-submission consultation will go to a venue in each of the Area Forum areas for an afternoon/evening drop in session. The Local Plan will be submitted in June with a public examination likely to be in the autumn this year.

LA/21 **MINUTES**

The Minutes of the Linton Area Forum held on Thursday 24<sup>th</sup> October 2013 were noted.

Reference to DCC on page 2, LA/14 should be SDDC.

LA/22 **REPORT BACK ON ISSUES RAISED AT THE LAST MEETING**

The Chairman reviewed those items raised at the last Meeting and the Forum Liaison Officer reported the progress made in each case.

Broadband Champions meetings have been disbanded but champion's roles exist. To find out more go to [www.digitalderbyshire.org.uk](http://www.digitalderbyshire.org.uk). On the digital derbyshire map, click on the icon to generate an email to the Broadband Champion.

Toons sign has been moved at Cadley island.

Flooding at Acresford Road (near Cricketts pub) - Nev Wallis, Drainage Officer contacted the land owner as need permission to enter the land, still awaiting response.

**Chris Payne at SDDC to liaise with County and Forum Liaison Officer to pursue the matter**

Gullies at Appleby Glade gave been done.

Caldwell road drainage was instructed on 7th November and works should be carried out within 3 months.

LA/23 **PUBLIC QUESTIONS ON ISSUES RAISED BY RESIDENTS**

It was reported that large amounts of sludge are left on the A444 at Castle Gresley at the St Modwens site, which is making the road very slippery. The road is being swept at night. This issue was also raised at the Safer Neighbourhood Meeting.

**Forum Liaison Officer to speak with the Clerk of works.**

It was reported that the road surface was poor at new traffic lights in Overseal. The Forum Liaison Officer confirmed that the surface was damaged when old lines were burnt off the road. A bid would be put forward to perform patching

works in the next financial year. It would not be known until the end of March if the funding has been secured

Resident asked when the new pedestrian refuge on the A444, Overseal near to the Co-operative would be carried out. This work is scheduled to commence on 17th February.

Cllr Hall raised that the road surface between Rosliston and Coton is in a very bad state.

**Forum Liaison Officer to make enquiries and report back to a future meeting.**

A444 Cadley island resurfacing works have not been done. Patching works have been carried out by Toons and Swadlincote Lane but not the roundabout.

**The Forum Liaison Officer confirmed that this should have been done at the same time as the Toons patching. Enquiries would be made with DCC.**

LA/24 **COUNTY COUNCIL ISSUES**

None

LA/25 **DISTRICT COUNCIL ISSUES**

The Chief Executive discussed the reduction in government funding from 2010 to 2018, totalling 1.25 million since 2010, which equates to 20% less. Savings have been made by looking at efficiencies, the management structure and support services but not cuts in services. £320,000 was saved last year and from April 2014 another £300,000 has to be saved. Capital investment has been made to the district's leisure facilities and improvements to recycling last year with the new plastics scheme.

The new golf course in Swadlincote will be making a big announcement on 13th February. Swadlincote Family Golf Centre, phase 1 should be open in the spring with the first 6 holes, followed closely by the development of a hotel.

Council tax is still to be decided on, with a government announcement on grant

funding awaited. No increases have been made over the past 4 years. The Finance and Management meeting will take place on 20th February and Council Tax will be set in March.

Councillor Wheeler raised that the District Council provides funding for concurrent functions, which will increase by 2% and the voluntary sector funding will also increase by 2%.

Cllr Wheeler discussed that the government are yet to announce a capping limit and whether this would be 1.5% or 2%.

Resident questioned the future in child care centres. The Forum Liaison Officer confirmed that budget reductions of 157 million are to be found and 36.7 million during the next financial year. Changes are proposed to mobile libraries and adult care services. A webpage called the Derbyshire Challenge can be found via the County Council website [www.derbyshire.gov.uk](http://www.derbyshire.gov.uk). Details of consultations can be found on this webpage.

The Chief Executive confirmed that SDDC work closely with DCC by a joint use of venues, for example, Social Services operate from the Civic offices. There are plans with County to share more property.

Councillor Wheeler confirmed that SDDC have no plans to charge for parking. This is good for the trading town. Council Tax reductions of 10% for a second home will also go in the new financial year.

**REPORT BACK ON ISSUES RAISED AT THE LAST MEETING**

At the last Linton Area Forum held on 29<sup>th</sup> January 2014 at Coton in the Elms Community Centre, the following issues were raised and a progress report is provided.

**Derbyshire County Council Issues:**

**1. ACRESFORD ROAD, NETHERSEAL: CARRIAGEWAY FLOODING**

Letter was sent to the adjacent land owner, requesting permission to enter land to investigate a suspected broken pipe. As no response had been received this was chased up by DCC.

SDDC to explore whether there is a land drainage issue.

**2. A444 BURTON ROAD, CASTLE GRESLEY: MUD ON CARRIAGEWAY**

The Clerk of Works has advised that the site is visited on a daily basis. If problems with mud are observed the developer is informed to take appropriate action.

District Council Area Planning Officer contacted Developer regarding their duty to Condition 26 of the outline requiring them to use the wheel washing facilities on site.

**3. ROSLISTON – COTON IN THE ELMS: CARRIAGEWAY DETERIORATION**

An inspection was carried out on 3 February 2014, where it was noted that the carriageway is in a generally sound condition. Two potholes were identified on the mini roundabout (junction with Main Street at Rosliston) and will be repaired accordingly.

**4. CADLEY HILL ROUNDABOUT, CASTLE GRESLEY: CARRIAGEWAY WORKS**

Surfacing work to the roundabout has now been completed.
