sOUTH DERBYSHIRE CRIME AND DISORDER **AUDIT 2001/2004 SUMMARY** (1 August 2004)

South Derbyshire below County rates for Violent Crime, Vehicle Crime and Domestic Burglary

Key Points

House Burglary

- Lowest Rate for 3 years
- Small areas have majority of burglaries. 3 in 5 postcodes in South Derbyshire had no burglary in 3 years.
- 1 in 4 postcodes where a burglary occurred experienced another burglary within 6 months.
- High proportions of burglaries opportunistic though open/unlocked downstairs windows and doors.
- High risk groups identified.

Offenders Profiles

- Majority 18-24 year old males.
- Links with drugs.

Violence

- Stable over the last year.
- Time and Location link to licensed premises and alcohol.
- Young males high proportion of offenders.

Vehicle Crime

- Both theft of and theft from vehicles dropping over the last year.
- Large proportion of theft of vehicles by under 18s.

Anti Social Behaviour

- Damage and Arson stable over the last year.
- Evening and night time problem, time and location linked to alcohol consumption.

Offender Profiles

- Small numbers of offenders responsible for high proportions of offences.
- 1 in 5 of the most prolific acquisitive crime offenders has also been arrested for drugs offences.

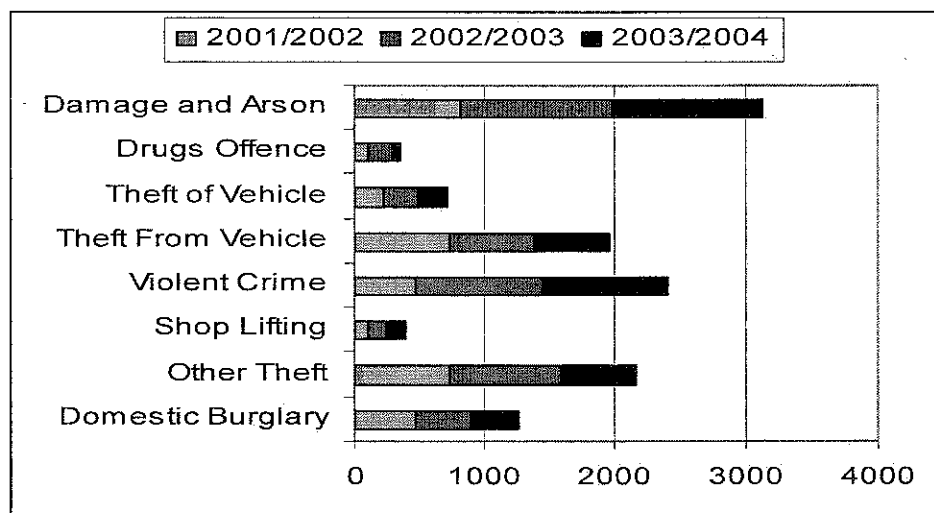

South Derbyshire was under the county rate for violent crime each year but followed the county rate up each year with a large rise from 2001/2002. This large rise can partially be explained by changes in the way police record violent crime.

South Derbyshire was under the County rate each year for vehicle crime, and has decreased each year even though the county rate increased slightly in the second year.

Domestic burglary rates in South Derbyshire have decreased each year and have been below the county rate. Even though the county rate increased significantly in the second year South Derbyshire continued to fall.

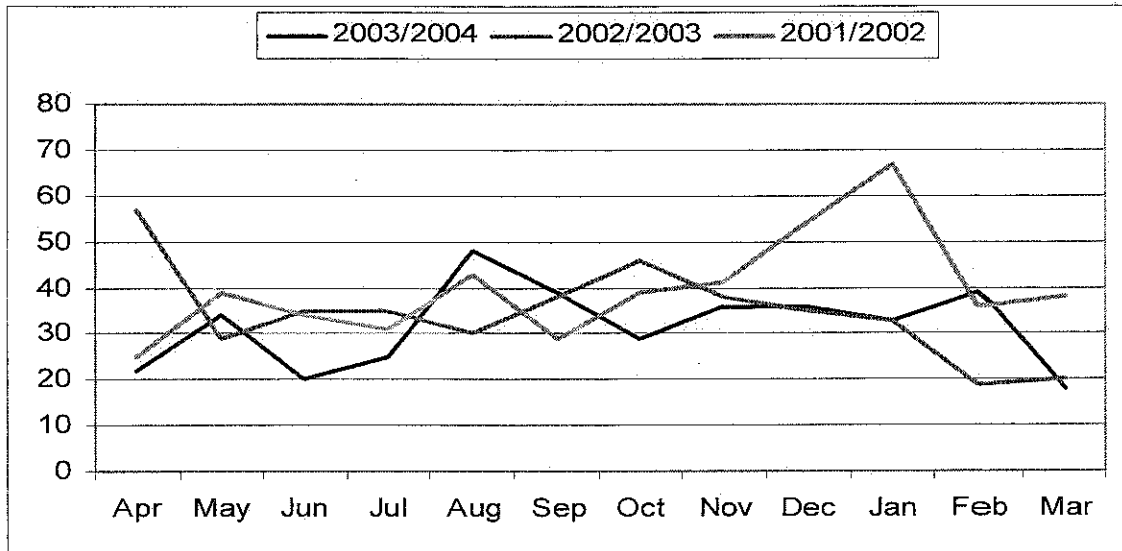

House Burglary

The numbers of burglaries has fallen in both years since 2001/2002. There was a large decline between November 2002 and April 2003, and the monthly average has been relatively stable in the last year.

Distraction Burglary

“Distraction burglary: any crime where a falsehood, trick or distraction is used on an occupant of a dwelling to gain, or try to gain, access to the premises to commit burglary.”

This particular crime usually targets older people and is especially distressing to victims. Due to the nature of the crime and the victims many are afraid to report the incident to the police for fear of being considered unable to look after themselves, therefore there is a large degree of underreporting. It is estimated that only between 1 or 2 out of 10 distraction burglaries are reported to the police. The average age of the victims is over 75 and a high number are single females. Liberal is a cross border operation to tackle distraction burglary offences. They are responsible for a rise in conviction rates from around 5% to over 20%.

Operation Liberal has had successful liberation days meeting the elderly, giving them advice on what to look out for and how to deal with unexpected callers. One of these was in the South Derbyshire area.

Other Acquisitive Crime - Other Theft and Shoplifting

Other thefts rose each from 2001/2002 to 2002/2003 and then dropped significantly to below the baseline year in 2003/2004.

Shoplifting rose by 50% between 2001/2002 and then dropped to 20% above the baseline year in 2003/2004

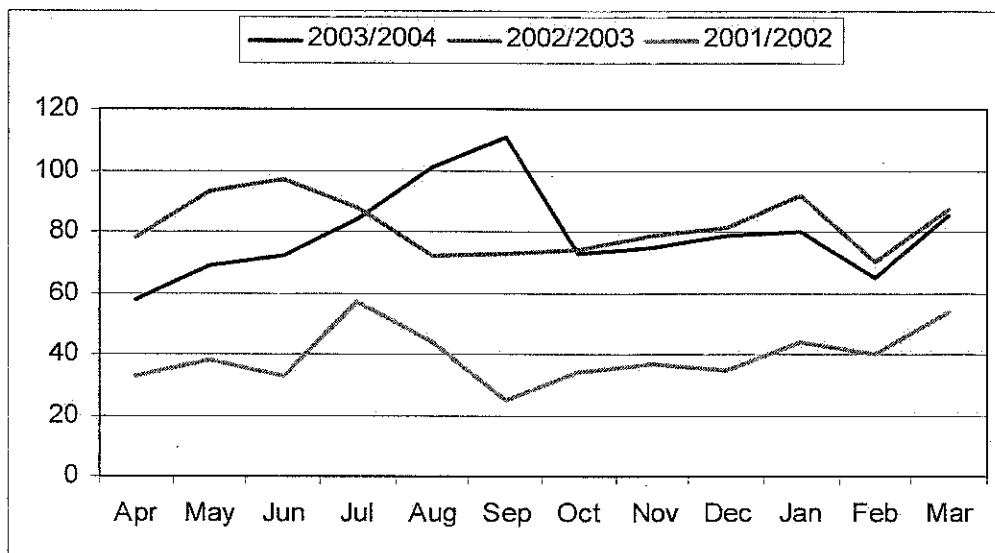

Violent Crime – This includes Assault, Robbery and Sexual Offences

Violent crime in South Derbyshire increased from 2001/2002 to 2002/2003 and then decreased in 2003/2004, although the levels in 2003/2004 are still higher than 2001/2002. The rise in 2002/2003 can partially be put down to changes in the way police record violent crimes.

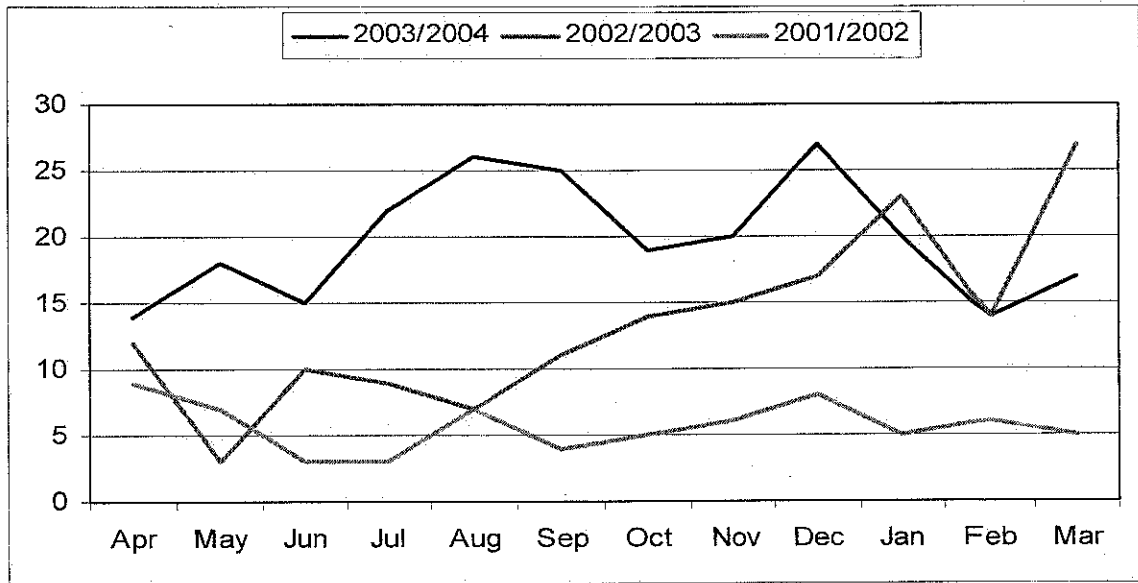

Domestic Violence

There has been an increase each year in domestic violence, however this will partially be due to changes in the way police record violent incidents. There are also it is suspected very many domestic violence incidents that do not get reported to the police, due to the victims fear of the offender and also do to financial reliance of the victim on the offender.

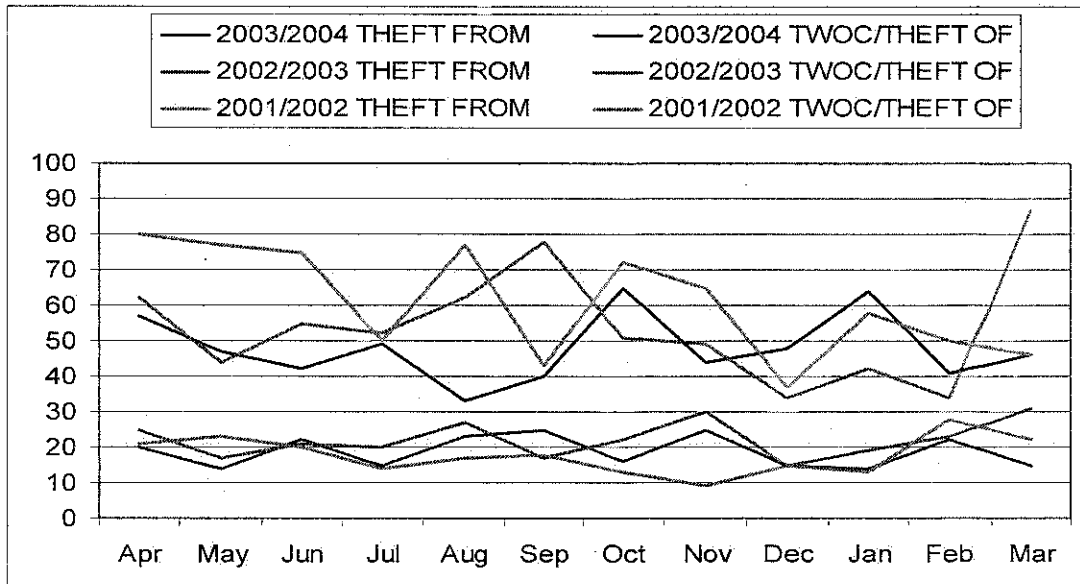

Vehicle Crime

Theft from vehicles has dropped each year and has been falling consistently for over 12 months. Theft of vehicles rose from 2001/2002 to 2002/2003 and dropped again from 2002/2003 to 2003/2004, however the 2003/2004 total is slightly higher than in 2001/2002, but has been falling monthly for around a year.

Monthly Trends

There are slight peaks in theft from vehicles around March/April and August/September coinciding with Easter and summer holidays.



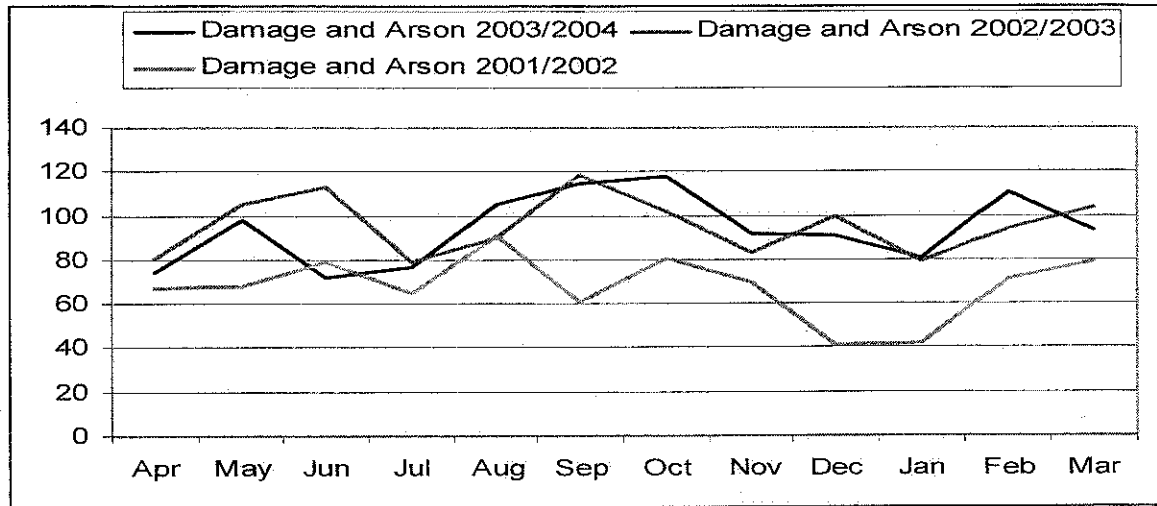

Anti Social Behaviour - Criminal Damage

There was a large rise in Damage and Arson from 2001/2002 to 2002/2003 and a small drop to 2003/2004. Damage and Arson has remained relatively stable over the last 10 months.

Monthly Trends

There are peaks from August to October and also around May and June. These correspond to summer holidays and Easter bank holidays.
