REPORT BACK ON ISSUES RAISED AT THE LAST MEETING

At the last Repton Area Forum held on 1st May 2012, at Repton Village Hall, the following issues were raised;

1. LEVEL CROSSING, FINDERN LANE, WILLINGTON

Further enquiries were made with Network Rail who advised that they were planning to undertake repairs to the crossing surface on Saturday 23 June 2012. Network Rail have requested that all future enquiries or complaints regarding Network Rail infrastructure be referred, in the first instance, to the Network Rail Helpline (08457 114141), so that it can be logged, a Service Request Number provided for future reference and the work progressed with the necessary degree of priority via the department concerned.

2. MAIN STREET AND THE GREEN, FINDERN – BLOCKED GULLIES

These gullies have all been jetted and are running clear.

3. POT HOLE REPAIRS - WATERY LANE, BRETBY, GEARY LANE, BRETBY, AND HARTSHORNE ROAD/REPTON ROAD

Officers from the area's Rapid Response Team attended on 4th May 2012 to carry out repairs as necessary to the above locations.

4. FOOTPATH DETERIORATION – BETWEEN VERE CLOSE AND TWYFORD ROAD, WILLINGTON

An inspection of this footpath has been carried out by an officer from DCC's Rights of Way Team, who has reported that although there is some slight lifting of the surface by tree roots, it is not considered to be a trip hazard

One small pothole was identified that requires filling and this will be added to the maintenance programme.

5. CARRIAGEWAY MARKINGS – KNIGHTS LANE, BRETBY

This matter has been investigated by an officer from the area's Traffic & Safety Team who, having measured the width of the carriageway, has advised that on average it is below 5.5m (central carriageway markings cannot be introduced below this width). Edge of carriageway markings are also unlikely as the lack of width would push vehicles towards the centre of the road, increasing the likelihood of collisions.

A review of the road safety record reveals that there has been one collision resulting in personal injury over the last 3 years, sadly a fatal. However, there does not appear to be a recurring problem and so the officer does not support additional road markings in this area.

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6. GULLY CLEANING

A copy of the gully cleanse route will be available to inspect at the meeting. However this document doesn't include dates, as the contractor updates the District Council on a daily basis. The list refers to the whole district gully cleanse which takes place in October, although some gullies receive an additional cleanse in May/June.
