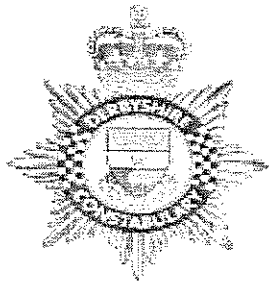

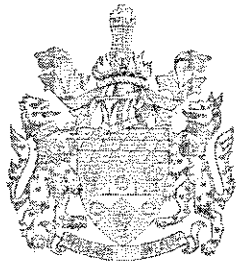

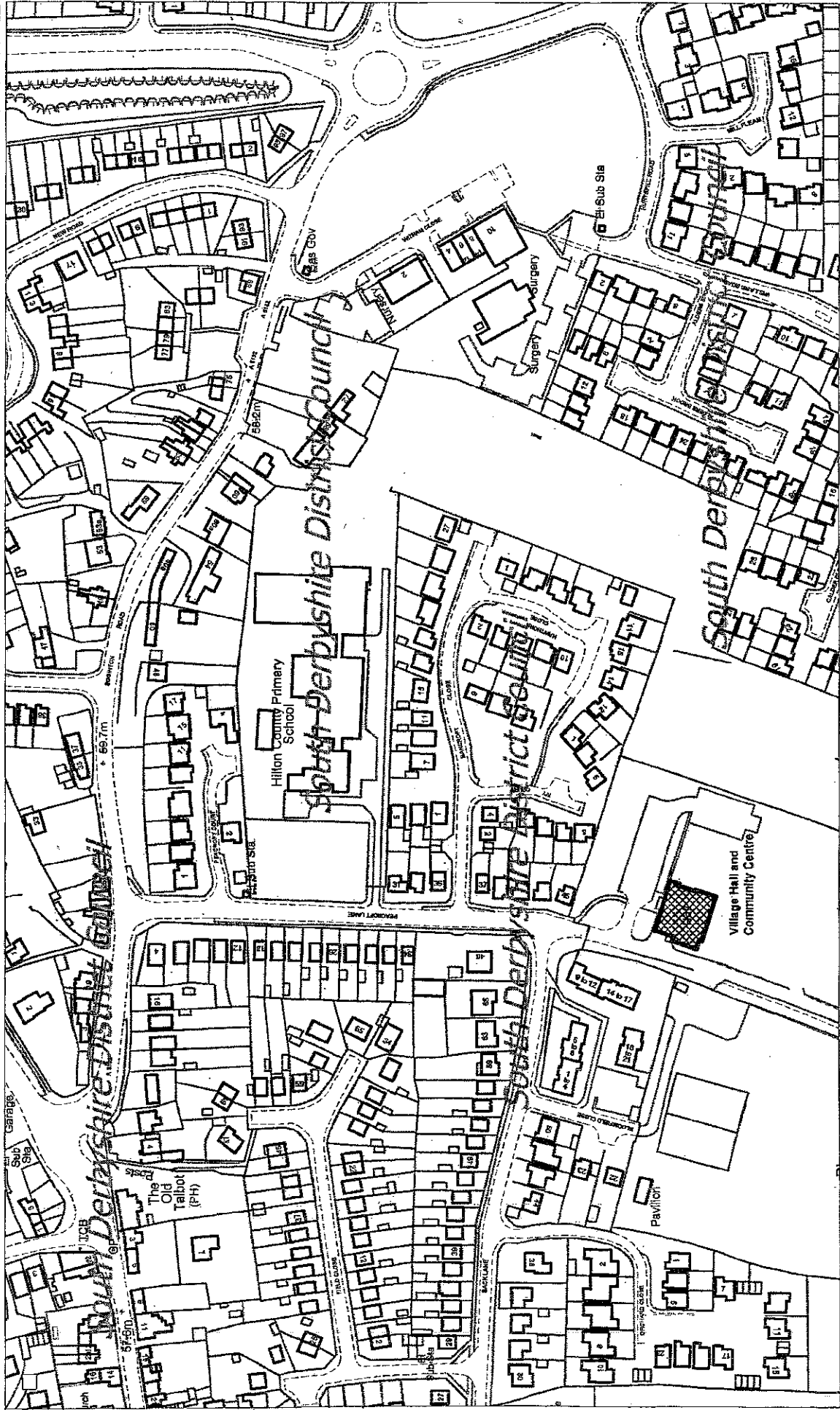

<p>1</p>	<p>Lis Kolkman welcomed everyone to the meeting and introductions were made from the panel. Inspector Paul Cannon introduced Inspector Nigel Lidsey who would be taking over his role at Swadlincote from 24th June.</p> <p>Apologies were received from Chris Hall; Veronica Stewart; Malcolm Yarnold</p>	
<p>2</p>	<p>Minutes of last meeting (to be agreed) and update on actions</p> <p>The minutes of the last meeting were agreed as a true record.</p>	
<p>3</p>	<p>Safer Neighbourhood Sergeant's Overview / Priorities Update</p> <p>Sgt Todd discussed year to-date crime figures for the area (April – May 2013 compared with the same period in 2012).</p> <p>Violent crime has increased by 9 but all crimes resulted in a positive outcome.</p> <p>Thefts had decreased by 3, with 10% having a positive outcome.</p> <p>Vehicle crimes have reduced by 8, with 43% having a positive outcome.</p> <p>Criminal damage has increased by 8 crimes.</p> <p>Drug offences have increased with 100% having a positive outcome.</p> <p>30% of all crimes have resulted in a positive outcome.</p> <p>Anti-social behaviour calls to service received 5 more calls in May and year to-date resulted in 10 more calls.</p>	

	<p>PCSO Waite ran through some of the recent Police initiatives and success stories: -</p> <p>Speed checks have been carried out in Hatton Tickets have been issued to individuals not wearing seat belts A scrap van was stopped in Foston and the driver issued with a £300 fixed penalty notice for not having a waste licence. One male was given 18 months for various offences in Hilton and disqualified for 2 years. One male charged for drink driving. Various cannabis warnings have been issued. One male is in prison for Class A and B drugs offences. Arrests were made following warrants in Soar Close. Warrants in Etwall revealed cannabis cultivation. One individual charged in Hilton for importing drugs. Posters have been put up around Hilton appealing for information following a young girl being robbed of her mobile phone. PCSO Waite discussed the community messaging scheme run by the Police and the ability to follow her on twitter. Residents can also obtain crime figures for their local area via the Police UK website.</p> <p>Priorities Update No priorities were set at the last meeting.</p>	
<p>4</p>	<p>Partnership update / funding / new project ideas</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The Partnership has recently set up a Facebook page, which is regularly updated with news and forthcoming events. • A Duke of Edinburgh programme is currently being developed in conjunction with Woodville Youth Centre. Volunteers are in place and training sessions are being delivered. • The 11th annual Liberation Day took place in May at Green Bank Leisure Centre with over 350 guests and exhibitors offering a wide range of advice and information to the over 60's of South Derbyshire. • The Partnership and Fire Service are putting together a cadet scheme following the success of a YES (Youth Engagement Scheme) project, which ran earlier in the year. • Sally Wigginton and the Police Youth Liaison Officer have been into schools giving talks to parents about internet security. • Ten alarms have been purchased for victims of domestic violence, which incorporate a GPS system. • A number plate security operation will take place on 24th June at the Frank Wickham Hall, Etwall. Residents can bring their cars to the village hall car park where anti-theft screws will be put into number plates. 	

	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Summer Vibe will be running again this year at Hilton Village Hall throughout the summer holidays. This year provision has been made for evening sessions for the older children. • The Partnership will be at the Festival of Leisure at Maurice Lea Park, Church Gresley on 29th and 30th June offering a push bike marking service. • Working alongside the Housing Department, the Partnership will be involved in a tenants participation scheme called the Dreamscheme from 5th to 9th August at Peartree Court, Etwall. This project has applied for funding of £500. The scheme engages pupils from John Port School to work in the community and encourage inter-generational working. • The Police Youth Liaison Officer, PC Hayley Perry has now moved on to work in Derby. The new officer in post is PC Denise Lomas. <p>An application for funding had been received from the Dreamscheme Open Space Project 2013 for £500. This project engages pupils from John Port School to assist in tidying up communal areas. The funding was duly granted.</p>	
5	<p>Local issues – open forum</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Resident raised that children were in danger of being run over due to people parking on pavements along Egginton Road. Police discussed the issue and confirmed they were aware of the situation and now that an existing car park was back in use it was felt that the problems should ease. • Etwall resident reported that their new speed sign was working well. • It was raised that the link road between the Mickleover Court Hotel and the 516 has been reduced to 40 mph and is being ignored. It was discussed the signage was not well placed by being on the bend. • The group discussed the issue of graffiti around the area. Sally confirmed that a specialist company had been out but their methods were to paint over it rather than remove it. Various options were discussed and possible projects. The main issue seems to be that the Council Depot's equipment will not remove the type of paint being used. Police have contacted schools with pictures of the tags but nothing significant as of yet. • Scropton Parish Council reported that further to reports of HGV's passing through the village, one driver had visited a resident and was very aggressive. • Hatton has also suffered spates of graffiti in the jitty opposite the newsagents, phone boxes and electric boxes along Station Road. There had also been vandalism to a bench on a bridle path. Police confirmed they were aware. • Resident raised that parking at the Co-op in Hatton is an issue.

EA/1. **APOLOGIES**

Apologies for absence from the Meeting were received from District and County Councillor Ford, District Councillor Bale, B. Cowley and M. Nesbitt.

EA/2. **APPOINTMENT OF VICE-CHAIRMAN**

Councillor Mrs. Patten was elected Vice-Chairman of the Area Forum for the ensuing year.

EA/3. **CHAIRMAN'S ANNOUNCEMENTS**

The Chairman read a note advising those present on the activities of the Environmental Forum and a leaflet was distributed with further information. She announced that no further information was available on the Rail Hub application, other than the recent media coverage, detailing that property firm Goodman and Shepherd Group had confirmed it had entered into a partnership.

A meeting would take place the following week involving the District Council and the developer partnership. A resident requested the date of this meeting

and the Chairman responded that it was to be confirmed. A document from the Planning Inspectorate was available, which detailed the planning process for dealing with proposals for nationally significant infrastructure projects. The Chairman requested that this document be circulated to parish councils. She confirmed that there would be the opportunity for public consultation and the District and parish councils could also respond. Residents wishing to register any concerns could email them to Kevin Exley, one of the Council's Planning Policy Officers: kevin.exley@south-derbys.gov.uk. A discussion took place on the recent press article that had quoted '6,000 jobs at rail hub'. A resident asked the source of this figure and the Chairman responded that the statement had been given by the developers, which the local press had picked up. The Chairman confirmed that no plans for the development had been viewed by the District Council. Residents were urged to engage in the planning process and to register any concerns.

A resident referred to a proposed development at a site in Castle Donington. The Interim Planning Policy Manager advised that the Planning Inspectorate had been notified of the proposal to submit a pre-application, which was likely to be in the early part of next year.

The Chairman updated on the flood alleviation scheme, which was nearing completion. The Egginton phase of the project was due to be completed on 13th August, with the Hatton section already being complete and completion of the ancillary works by November 2013. The Chairman thanked Nestlé for their generosity and support for the scheme. She also gave an update on the planning application for the proposed Foston Pig Farm.

There was a discussion about the Local Plan, which was due to be published at the end of December or early in the New Year. The District Council was working closely with Amber Valley Borough, Derby City and Derbyshire County Councils. The Director of Community & Planning responded to a question regarding whether the Plan would encompass wind turbines, advising that very large proposals were dealt with by the Planning Inspectorate and smaller proposals would be determined through the District Council's planning application process.

EA/4. **MINUTES**

The Minutes of the Etwall Area Forum held 30th January 2013 were noted.

EA/5. **REPORT BACK ON ISSUES RAISED AT THE LAST MEETING**

The Chairman referred to the report circulated with the Agenda. She highlighted the issues raised at the last Meeting and the progress made to date. A resident raised a concern about the 'gold card' renewals item that 'the most common reason that a property did not appear on the site was if it was new'. The resident responded that this could not be the reason, quoting the ages of some of the properties concerned in this case. The Chairman asked the County Council's representative to report back the point raised and give an update to the next Area Forum.

A resident commented that the Tree Officer had given a good report at the last Area Forum and asked whether the District Council had an update on the Ash dieback situation. The Director of Community & Planning agreed to report to the next Area Forum.

He also gave an update on the new kerbside recycling scheme, due to commence in the Autumn of 2013. The new service would include the collection of cardboard and plastics in addition to the glass, cans, aerosols, foil, textiles, paper and magazines that were currently collected. A number of 'road shows' would be held and a dedicated page provided on the Council's website. Temporary staff would be employed to assist in the introduction of the new recycling service, to give advice to residents, at home if required. A resident asked whether wax cartons (tetra pack) would be included in the new recycling scheme. The Chairman asked that this be clarified at the next meeting.

EA/6. **PUBLIC QUESTIONS ON ISSUES RAISED BY RESIDENTS**

A resident asked about the future of the existing recycling 'bring' sites and whether there were any plans to reduce them. Councillor Mrs. Patten answered that a review would take place 6 months after the commencement of the new scheme.

EA/7. **DISTRICT COUNCIL ISSUES**

The Director of Community & Planning informed of the official opening of the artificial turf pitch at John Port School on Monday 24th June. The new pitch was the result of a partnership between the John Port School, Active Nation, the District Council and Hilton Harriers.

He also advised that the Council's Committee process would become paperless, resulting in savings. A resident raised a query on viewing planning applications on the website, stating that access was sometimes denied and not consistent when viewing a PDF document. The Director of Community & Planning was asked to look into the issue and report back to the next meeting.

The summer activities brochure was distributed and the Director of Community & Planning asked parish council representatives to promote this locally and give feedback on staff delivery.

EA/8. **DATE OF NEXT MEETING**

The date and venue of the next Etwall Area Forum would be confirmed in due course.

REPORT BACK ON ISSUES RAISED AT THE LAST MEETING

At the last Etwall Area Forum held on 18th June 2013 at the Hatton Centre, the following issues were raised and a progress report is provided:-

1. ASH TREE DISEASE UPDATE

The latest information relating to Ash Dieback, from both FERA and Forestry Commission Research is very complex and detailed, very much dependant on land ownership and area risk categorisation. Although yet to be confirmed, the disease has reached woodlands near Ashby (Willersley Woods), Albert Village (Pick Triangle) and Swadlincote Woodlands. I am due to send a sample of leaf material from the suspected trees at Swadlincote woodlands for testing.

The Forestry Commission have recently issued a management plan in which they outline how to deal with confirmed outbreaks.

In a nutshell, their aim is slow spread of the disease to highly valued woodlands, such as the predominant Ash woods in the Peak District, introduce biosecurity measures and when confirmed issue Plant Health Orders, which include these measures and others (restrictive movement of timber, immediate felling of young trees etc), they have divided the country into 'risk zones'. These zones are to categorise the value of trees/woodlands, the percentage of Ash trees affected and priorities of how to deal with the spread.

If the disease is confirmed at Swadlincote Woodlands, I propose to issue a statement on our website. I will update all when I have more information.

2. WAXED CONTAINERS

The recycling scheme is ultimately driven by whether the products collected can be readily passed to reprocessors i.e. to be recycled. There currently isn't a ready market for the tetrapak type packaging. However part of our contract with our recycling partner is to look to extend the range of materials collected over the life of the contract. We're still very much in the early stages of this eight year contract but will look to develop the range of materials collected in the future.
