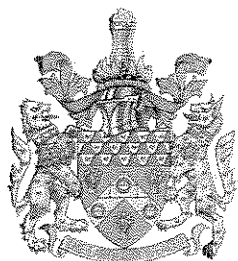

<p>1 Chair's Introduction, Apologies Frank Hood welcomed everyone to the meeting and introductions were made from the panel.</p>	
<p>2 Minutes of last meeting (to be agreed) and update on actions The minutes of the last meeting were agreed as a true record. Frank Hood added that he had also served as a County Councillor for 4 years.</p>	
<p>3 Safer Neighbourhoods Sergeant's Overview / Priorities Update</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Sgt Todd gave an update from the Police on events and crime statistics. • Area 2 continues to be a low crime area and a safe place to live. • Victim based crimes have decreased by 9% on previous years, totalling 203 crimes, which is 20 crimes less than last year. A quarter of these have positive outcomes. A slight increase occurred in August but this then reduced again by the end of September owing to positive action by local officers. • Six violent crimes occurred in September, two with injury and four without. 	

	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • No sexual offences • Theft has reduced from 26 to 18 crimes this year • Police have targeted individuals regarding theft of fuel oil at Findern Primary School. Four offenders were arrested and interviewed. One was identified and charged and is now serving 3 months in prison. • Following fuel thefts on the A50, individuals pleaded guilty and received a one-year suspended sentence, £250 costs and ordered to carry out 250 hours community service. This was a result of offenders being caught on cameras purchased by the Safer South Derbyshire Partnership. • Dwelling burglaries have seen a 75% reduction <p>Priorities update No priorities were set at the last meeting.</p>	
4	<p>Question and Answer Surgery</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Resident queried the outcome to an incident at Findern Village Stores. PC Fearn confirmed this incident was not dealt with by Derbyshire Police. Sgt Todd advised the store owner to contact the Police for an update. • Newton Solney resident raised that anti-social behaviour had occurred over the summer months on recreation ground off Mill Close near the river. People had bonfires, BBQ's, drinking and littering and late night fishing. Police advised residents to ring 101 so that they could visit the scene, check fishing licences are in place and deal with any offences. The Neighbourhood Wardens team can also issue fixed penalty notices for littering. • Cllr Stanton raised an issue with a resident who uses a recumbent bicycle. He stated that it was very difficult for motorists to see this bike and therefore was very dangerous. One resident raised that the same individual had run into his stationary tractor and was now claiming damages. Police advised that they would need evidence of him being out of control before they could take any action, but the recumbent bikes are legal. It was stated that the cyclist weaves in front of buses and travels along Swarkestone Bridge with his wife following behind in a car recording the journey on a camera. • Cllr Ford raised that many cyclists travel along without lights or reflective gear and this makes them very vulnerable. • Resident asked whether 23.6% positive outcome was considered good or bad. Sgt Bateman explained that the Force's target is 30% and that South Derbyshire was slightly above the national average. • There is a DCC cabinet meeting next week to discuss the installation of a barrier on a small footpath on Irvine Close in Stenson fields. This barrier is designed to stop motor cyclists but allows pedestrians access through.

6	<p>Partnership Update / Funding / New Project Ideas</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Sgt Bateman discussed a bike safety event next week during half term. This will be at Hilton Village Hall on Monday and Newhall Park on Thursday where high Visibility bags and other items will be handed out to young people. The Partnership and Police delivered a bike safety talk to Etwall Primary School this week with lots of giveaways to help keep them seen during the dark nights. • During the summer the Partnership put together sessions called summer vibe. These took place in Hilton and Newhall and children took part in Ozbox sessions, street dance, sports and crafts activities. • The Partnership delivered domestic homicide review training for local agencies who have links with victims of domestic abuse. • A no cold calling zone has been set up in Stenson Fields. • 4 young people have recently come off Acceptable Behaviour Contracts owing to good behaviour. • Chris Smith discussed Safer Neighbourhood Funding and currently Area 2 has spent £1,120 towards CCTV in Stenson Fields. After Christmas any under-spend goes into a central pot, which is then available for all areas to bid into. 	
7	<p>Any Other Business</p> <p>Gareth Evans (Senior Safer Neighbourhood Warden) discussed recent operations to tackle fly tipping at recycling centres. Five fixed penalty notices were issued at £75 each. Wardens have also issued four fixed penalty notices for littering from cars and fast food. Reporting cards have been put through doors encouraging people to report incidents of dog fouling.</p>

RA/10. **APOLOGIES**

Apologies for absence from the Meeting were received from Councillors Shepherd and Murray and L. Nash.

RA/11. **MINUTES**

The Minutes of the Repton Area Forum held on 19th July 2012 were noted.

RA/12. **REPORT BACK ON ISSUES RAISED AT THE LAST MEETING**

The Chairman reviewed those items raised at the last Meeting and reported the progress made in each case.

With regard to the drainage issues on Bretby Lane, the Forum Liaison Officer reported that there were still problems in this area which we were subject to ongoing investigation.

RA/13. **PUBLIC QUESTIONS ON ISSUES RAISED BY RESIDENTS.**

A representative from Repton Parish Council reported that the Broom Hills Field Pavilion was in need of some repair work. This had recently been surveyed by South Derbyshire District Council (SDDC), and it was on the SDDC owned part of the site.

The Head of Housing & Environmental Services agreed to look into this matter and provide a response direct to Repton Parish Council.

It was reported that venues, such as Milton Village Hall, were very difficult for those who were hearing impaired, and a mobile audio loop system should be available for use in such venues. It was suggested that there were 2 sources for this equipment, either CamTAD (Campaign for Tackling Acquired Deafness), and also South Derbyshire CVS had a portable hearing loop which could be borrowed.

The Head of Housing & Environmental Services responded that the use of a system would be investigated for the next meeting.

It was reported that the boundary commission had published an interim conclusion to their recent investigations, and it had been suggested that South Derbyshire be renamed 'Derbyshire South & Swadlincote'. It was also queried why Swadlincote was not a parished area, with a precept. The Head of Housing and Environmental Services responded that if there was community demand for an un-parished area to become parished, the District would support this. However there was no public demand for this at the current time.

A Resident asked if the Domino Public House at Hartshorne could be considered for enforcement, as it was considered to be an eyesore.

The Head of Housing and Environmental Services responded that he would ask an Officer to assess this site.

RA/14. **COUNTY COUNCIL ISSUES**

The Forum Liaison Officer reported that a Healthwatch Derbyshire consultation exercise was being undertaken. This was a new initiative set up by the Government to make sure that residents could influence and challenge health and social care services in Derbyshire. The consultation process had been extended to 31st October 2012, and further information was available at GP's surgeries, libraries and online.

It was also reported that a Mineral Plan consultation was taking place, and that this was available via the Derbyshire County Council website.

RA/15. **DISTRICT COUNCIL ISSUES**

The Head of Housing and Environmental Services reported that the District Council was currently undertaking consultation on the Local Development Framework. He reported that this would have an implication on all major developments in the local area. Further Information would be available via the local press, on the website and in libraries etc.

The District Council was also currently undertaking consultation on the Council Tax Support Scheme. Changes to this scheme would only affect people in receipt of Council Tax Benefit. It was proposed that funding passed from Central Government to the District Council would be 10% less which equalled £500,000. South Derbyshire District Council currently supported 6,000 people and 2 thirds received 100% support towards their council tax. As the funding was being reduced by 10%, the District Council had to decide if they could still afford this level of benefit. Options that were being considered were listed within the presentation. Final proposals would need to be in place by the end of December 2012, and the Council would decide how they were going to deal with this issue on 24th January 2013. The Scheme must be in place by the end of January 2013 and would operate from 1st April 2013.

REPORT BACK ON ISSUES RAISED AT THE LAST MEETING

At the last Repton Area Forum held on 25th October 2012, at Milton Village Hall, the following issues were raised;

SOUTH DERBYSHIRE DISTRICT COUNCIL

1. DOMINO PUBLIC HOUSE - HARTSHORNE

This site has been considered, however, would not be suitable for action. The buildings have been demolished and the rubble spread across the site and deliberately left higher across the front, presumably to prevent unauthorised access, which would be likely to cause far more concern.
